This will be done through in-class discussions and presentations.

EXPECTATIONS

All students are expected to:

- Recall and strengthen the ability to transfer their knowledge of grammatical concepts from oral language to written language.
- Read actively in order to keep up with the reading and effectively participate in class discussions, as well as complete the majority of the writing prompts.
- Turn in homework on time. Homework that is turned in one day late will be received based 70 (70 being the highest grade). Failure to turn in the homework can cause students to fall behind in that day's classwork, as most homework will prepare them for the next in-class lecture/activity.
- Show honesty when researching and citing their sources, techniques that we will explore thoroughly throughout the year. No form of plagiarism will be tolerated or excused.
- Be responsible when working during class. They will be asked to manage their time wisely, study for tests and quizzes ahead of time and ask for help if their grades are falling behind or in doubt. Also, be able to work with an agenda.

- Respect classmates and their opinions. As we will be having in-class conversations about the many literary texts read throughout the year, students are expected to show maturity and respect to all classmates and their varied opinions.

Course expectations:

- Bring all necessary material to class.
- Speak English at all times.
- Make notes when reading is assigned and during class.
- Access information through reading a variety of sources.
- Finish work in the allotted time.
- Turn in homework on time.
- Actively participate in class.
- Make up for any missed evaluation and/or classwork.

ASSESSMENT

Students' grades will be based on a variety of assignments such as classwork, homework, quizzes, tests and individual/cooperative work projects. The weight of each category is as follows:

40% Classwork and homework

60% Exams, quizzes, essays, projects

WEEKLY FOLDER

Students' evaluations will be sent weekly through Friday folder. It is important to review this work and make sure students keep them somewhere handy for future review. Midterm and final exams will be based on previous tests. Students will have the opportunity to improve all test grades through corrections, except midterm and final exams.
