The Life Ahead Methodology promotes autonomy, organization, responsibility, and social skills. Its major goal is to produce self-reliant individuals who will assume ever-greater responsibility for their own learning.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

English IV emphasizes the development of communication skills, including grammar, composition, and vocabulary. Students develop writing skills through various types of composing: paragraphs, outlines, essays, business letter writing, book reports, etc. Literature studies include a variety of genres (short stories, poetry, drama, novels, plays, etc.) and develop an understanding of how the craft of writing has changed throughout history.

OBJECTIVES

- Read a novel or play critically.
- Read difficult works of old literature, including Shakespeare, and make their own notes.
- Be able to follow the 5-step writing process.
- Write multiple analytical essays and use sources.
- Successfully engage in peer editing.
- Use embedded quotes in their writing.
- Use correct citations in their writing.
- Compare works of literature, including short stories, plays, poems, and novels across centuries and curriculums.
- Be able to correctly make inferences from different texts.
- Be able to analyze and reflect upon a variety of texts.
- Write a work cited page.
- Conduct a research project that includes footnotes and MLA citations.

CONTENT

Grammar

- TOEFL-related grammar exercises
- Identification exercises
- Commonly misused words, applied rules and conventions to essays and paragraphs
- Research paper elements applying grammatical rules, diction, and citation formatting.

SKILL STRANDS

- Analyze ideas and recurring themes found in a text.
- Recognize effects and multiple causes within a story in order to make inferences and/or predictions
- Practice oral proficiency recording videos and engaging in public speaking activities.

EXPECTATIONS

- Be able to recognize and analyze the main works of English Literature from Norman times to the present.

- Be able to demonstrate a mastery of English conventions in all written and oral tasks.

ASSESSMENT

The course will be assessed by diagnostic, formative, and summative assessments. Assessment methods may include self-assessment, peer assessment, teacher assessment, and assessment by invited others. At the end of the year, students will participate in a Project-Based Learning activity or be part of the Internship program. Both activities require a final presentation that will represent the final exam grade.

WEEKLY FOLDER

Students' evaluations will be shared in the Friday folder. Midterm and final exams will be based on previous activities and evaluations. Students will have the opportunity to improve all test grades through corrections, except for midterm and final exams.
