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LIFE AHEAD METHODOLOGY

The Life Ahead Methodology promotes autonomy, organization, responsibility, and social skills. Its major goal is to produce self-reliant individuals who will assume an ever-greater responsibility for their own learning.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Sociology is an introductory course to explore the study of different groups and their interests within a society. Students will explore the ways sociologists view society, and how they study the social world. In addition, students will examine culture, socialization, deviance and the structure and impact of institutions and organizations. Also, students will study selected social problems and how change impacts individuals and societies. Focus will be placed on the issues most relevant to student's lives.

OBJECTIVES

- Conduct their own research by successfully using the scientific method.
- Identify sociological issues in El Salvador and their causes.
- Analyze worldwide culture, cultural norms and conventions.
- Evaluate problems in society based on sociological perspective.
- Improve writing and research skills.
- Understand the theoretical framework through which sociologists study social problems.

CONTENT

The ASA (American Sociology Association) National Standards for High School Sociology represent current knowledge in the field at an introductory level. The National Standards are organized into four learning domains, each representing a broad area of sociological knowledge and study appropriate for the high school level. Each domain is accompanied by 3-4 assessable competencies.
